The Right Choice

George Wishart came from Pitarrow in what was called Forfarshire in Scotland. When he was old enough, he went to university in Europe. He came into contact with people called the Reformers – Christians who believed that what the Roman Catholic church taught was different from the Bible's teaching. George was encouraged to read the Bible for himself.

He was studying New Testament Greek and when he returned to Scotland in 1534 he taught Greek at a school in Montrose. The church authorities didn't like him teaching his pupils to read the Bible in its original language, or their own, so he had to leave. In 1543 he met John Foxe in Cambridge who wrote a famous book about Christian martyrs.

In 1544 he returned to Scotland, preaching the good news about Jesus. The Roman Catholic church was very much against him and he needed a bodyguard. He was John Knox who became Scotland's greatest reformer. Cardinal David Beaton was determined to stamp out Reformation teaching and George was arrested and put in prison in St Andrews.

Before George was hanged and burnt, the hangman asked George to forgive him, which he did. Even though he lost his life, George would spend eternity in the presence of Jesus. Who do you think made the right choice – George Wishart or Cardinal Beaton?
